Youth Collective Online: Participation guidelines

All online platforms will be safe spaces for everyone to express themselves freely and creatively. With this in mind there are a few guidelines to sharing the space with each other.

By registering your interest we expect all Youth Collective attendees to follow the behaviours set out in this guidance, if you do not meet the above expectations you may be asked to leave the online sessions and discussion space.

Session guidance and expectations

- Ensure that the space you are in doesn't reveal any personal / sensitive information and your background is clear of any inappropriate material (i.e. inappropriate posters).
- Any inappropriate, disrespectful, or potentially harmful behaviours or language will not be tolerated and the member of staff present will remove anyone who breaches this from the session or remove their access to the Discord page.
- Report any bad behaviour, bullying or harassment to a member of CAC staff.
- Conversations and comments need to focus on the content of the session and not divert away from this.
- Respect each other and everyone's opinions – appreciate everyone has differences.
- Listen and allow people to speak, don't talk over others.
- If there are a lot of participants in the session, we may ask everyone to mute unless you are speaking.
- You are free to leave the session at any point but you must join the sessions on time.
- If anybody is experiencing mental health concerns prior, during or post the sessions please get in touch. Although we are not professional trained mental health workers we can try our best to support and provide resources to direct you for help.
- We are committed to ensuring the safest online space possible for our Youth Collective. As part of this we have certain Safeguarding procedures in place to protect you, which include the registration process and disabling certain zoom functions.
- We advise having your Zoom name as first name only.
- If you are contacted outside of the session by someone claiming to be part of the Youth Collective in a way that makes you feel uncomfortable or feels inappropriate, email us straight away. You can also speak to an adult at home, or school, or work that you trust. You can block anyone that makes you feel uncomfortable.
- If you feel something isn't right please speak out if you feel you can, and contact a member of CAC staff involved in the session. You can ask to stay on for a conversation at the end of the session, or send an email.
